New Testament Reading: Luke 24:1-49 *Jesus rises and appears to the disciples*

### **Devotion: Why do you seek the living among the dead?**

The woman who went to visit Jesus' grave Easter morning did not expect to find the living among the dead. They sought the dead among the dead. Who goes to a cemetery thinking they might find that the dead have become alive? The dead don't become alive. That's the way of the world as we know it. They were amazed, astounded and somewhat terrified, when they encountered the heavenly beings who told them, "*He is not here, but has risen.*" What would you and I think, if we were in their position? When they returned and told the disciples, the disciples thought they were out of their minds. Not even the reminder of Jesus' own words could convince them that the woman had found the living among the dead. Jesus' resurrection challenges our ability to believe, because it is absolutely contrary to our experience of life in this world.

Eventually fear and trembling gave way to the joy of believing. When they believed, Jesus' resurrection made such an impression on the disciples that they became completely changed persons. His resurrection convinced them that He truly is the Son of God; and they ordered their lives accordingly. With great boldness and courage, they told the good news of His resurrection and called others to faith in His holy name. Not even the threat of death, could cause them to change their tune. The resurrection of Jesus was so shocking, so spectacular that it convinced them beyond any doubt that He is Lord, that there is no other name given under heaven by which we must be saved, and that everyone who calls on His name will be saved in time and for eternity!

We do not experience Jesus' resurrection in the same way as the disciples and women who went to His tomb Easter morning. But nevertheless we do experience His resurrection in their words of witness, in the water of our baptism and through the forgiveness of His body and blood in communion. Jesus' resurrection is the most remarkable event. It shows us that He truly is the Son of God and that the Father accepted His sacrifice to take away the sin of the world. Jesus' resurrection changed the lives of the first believers. Jesus' resurrection has changed countless lives over the ages. Jesus' resurrection changes our lives too!
