Devotion: Bread of Life

Over an extended period of time hunger and thirst can affect the growth and development of the human body and impact brain function. We all need food and water, but as important as food and drink are for our bodies, there is a bread and water that are more important for our souls; and that is the spiritual nourishment and refreshment Jesus gives through faith in His name; forgiveness of sin, peace with God and the promise resurrection to life everlasting.

Jesus is the living bread from heaven which a person may eat and live forever. Jesus slakes our thirst for righteousness in the water of baptism. He nourishes our faith in forgiveness and the Holy Spirit, through the bread and wine of Holy Communion. As He said to the people who sought bread in the gospel of John, so He says to us, *“I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst.”*
